


## Scoutbook


- This will be your main source of information as a scout and a parent.
- You will need a password and username to access this site.
- You can create an account or reset your username and password.
- You will be able to see your scout, their rank, their advancements, their patrol, their merit badges, their awards as well as their payment logs.
- ► This will be the location of our Troop events and where you will find detailed information and be able to RSVP to those events.
- If your scout wants to start a merit badge, this page is where you would request a merit badge counselor or if you are a merit badge counselor, you will be able to check off requirements.






## Scoutbook Basics



- The 3 lines will give you an option to get back to your Dashboard.
- The house at the top take you to the Home screen.
- The < will take you back to your last page.



# How To:

- Check your Scout's Balance
  - ▶ Go down and click on your Scout's name.
  - Scroll down to click on your Scout's Payment Log.
  - Everything in red is money owed.
  - Everything in gray is a credit.
  - Dues are \$15.00/month for 10 months out of the year. Once a year, there is a re-charter fee of \$165.00 for youth beginning April 1st and \$110.00 for adults.
  - Some events will also require additional fees.
  - ▶ If your Scout and any family members or friends work on their behalf at certain events such as Christmas Tree Lot set-up and tear down or David's Cemetery Wreath laying and clean up, your Scout will earn \$10.00/per person per hour toward their Scout account.
  - Dues can be paid by cash, check or for a fee, there is a Square account.

## How To:

- Request a Merit Badge Counselor
  - Click on your Scout's name
  - ▶ There you will see all the Merit Badges, Awards and Advancements received
  - Scroll down to Your Scouts Advancement and click
  - This screen will show your Scouts percentages of items they are working on
  - Scroll to the bottom of the page to Start Another Merit Badge and click
  - Scroll again to the bottom and click on Start a Merit Badge
  - You will see a list of all available Merit Badges with a special badge to the right of the Eagle Required badges
  - ▶ Click on the Merit Badge your scout would like to start
  - ▶ Click on Invite Counselor. This will give you a list of all the counselors. You will then need to find one that serves as the Counselor for the badge you want to start
  - Another quick way to see who is a MB Counselor is by looking at the list on our Troop 375 website.
  - Click on the Counselor to Invite them

## How To:

#### RSVP to an Event

- If you scroll halfway down the page main Dashboard page, you will see Upcoming Events.
- Click on whatever event you wish to RSVP to.
- ▶ You will then see all the details about that event.
- Find you and your scout and click on the blue circle with the? Inside and choose Yes or No. Leaving it the way it is means Maybe.
- ▶ If there are events, please RSVP so we can get an accurate headcount.
- ► There is also a place at the bottom of the page to add a comment. If you wish to post a comment, you must hit the Post Comment button at the bottom. Everyone will be able to see the comments posted.

## Scoutbook Plus Internet Advancement

- Not sure if everyone has access to this website.
- This will give you access to check your Scout's service hours and camping nights.
- This is also the website we would keep track of hours and nights.
- ► There is also a calendar on this site. The Scoutbook calendar does not transfer over to this calendar.
- This Advancement Site is new and is being updated on a regular basis so it may or may have some errors.

## Tecumseh Council

- ▶ This site allows you to see the Council calendar, new, events and resources.
- You can sign up for certain events through this website such as Merit Badge Trail Drive, adult training and certain Council events.
- If you are not on the Council E-mail Blast, you can also go to resources and sign up. These e-mails are weekly but contain lots of useful information.

## Flickr

# What Does Scouting Cost?

- Beginning April 1, 2024 costs are:
  - Scouts \$85.00 for National Fee + \$80.00 for Council Fee Annually = \$165.00/Year
  - Registered Adults \$65.00 National + \$45.00 Council Fee Annually = \$110.00/Year
- ▶ Troop Dues (Scouts Only) Are \$15.00 / Month for 10 Months a Year = \$150.00
- Some Activities Cost Extra and Will Be Billed To Your Scout Account. Examples:
  - Cedar Point Campout
  - White Water Rafting
  - Summer Camp
- Beginning January 1, 2024, You Are Responsible to Pay Your National and Council Fees Online
- ► Troop Dues Can Be Paid By Cash, Check Or Through Our Square App
  - ▶ If The Square App Is Used, Additional Fees Will Apply
  - ▶ The Fees, As Of 2/23/24 Are 2.9% +.30 Which Equates To A \$3.20 Fee Per \$100.00 Charge

## Scout Ranks

- Scout Rank
  - ► Covers The Basic Scouting Information They Need To Know In Order To Be A Good Scout
  - Should Be Earned Soon After Joining
- ► Tenderfoot, Second Class & First Class
  - These Ranks Cover Skills in Camping, Hiking, Cooking, First Aid, Nature, Fitness, Swimming, Citizenship & Leadership
    - ▶ Should Be Earned Within The First 1-2 Years
    - ► The Scouts Can Earn Requirements For These Ranks At The Same Time However, The Ranks Must Be Earned In Order
- ▶ Star, Life & Eagle
  - ▶ These Ranks Focus on Active Participation, Community Service, Leadership, & Merit Badges
  - ► Each Of These Ranks May Take Up To A Year To Earn
- Scouts Can Work On Advancement Until Their 18<sup>th</sup> Birthday





## What Forms Do I Need?

- One Time
  - ▶ BSA Registration/Application For The Scout & Any Registered Adults
- Annually
  - Activity Consent Form Scout Only
  - Medical Forms Registered Adults & Scouts
    - ▶ Parts A & B Are Required Yearly
    - ▶ Part C Is Required For All Scouts and Only Registered Adults Camping For More Than 72 Hours. ALL Scouts MUST Have Parts A, B & C To Participate in Activities.
      - ► Part C MUST Be Signed By A Doctor
- Youth Protection Training
  - This Is For Registered Adults and Scouts Over 18 and MUST Be Updated Every 2 Years
  - ▶ YPT Training is on the My Scouting website

## Youth Safety

- Beginning January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, <u>ONLY</u> BSA Registered Adults Are Permitted To Drive & Attend Camping Events With The Troop
- Registered Adults MUST Complete & Remain Current In Their Youth Protection Training (YPT)
- No One On One Contact This Includes:
  - Texting
  - Meetings In-Person or Virtual
  - E-mailing
  - Phone Calls
  - ▶ All Forms Of Communication Whether In-Person Or Not <u>MUST</u> Be 2 People Deep
    - Ex. If Your Son Sends A Text To An Adult Leader, They Must Copy You Or Another Adult
- Leaders/Adults & Parents May NOT Share Tents With Scouts
- Scouts Are Only Allowed To Share Tents With Other Scouts Who Are Less Than 2 Years in Age Difference
- Please Review The Youth Protection Booklet In The Front Of Your Scout's Handbook With Your Scout. Not Only Is This A Great Way To Talk To Your Scout About Safety, It Also Fulfils A Requirement For Scout Rank.

# **Fundraising**

- Our Troop Participates in Several Fundraising Opportunities
- Earnings For Each Scout
  - Our Troop Has Activities That Your Scout Can Participate In To Earn Money Toward Their Scout Account
  - During These Events, Your Scout, Parents, Siblings & Relatives Or Friends Can Also Participate To Earn Money For Your Scout
  - ▶ At These Specific Events, Each Participate Earns \$10.00/Hour Toward Your Scout Account
  - ▶ The Scout Can Earn Service Hours Instead Of The Money Toward The Scout Account
  - These Events Include:
    - Christmas Tree Lot
    - David's Cemetery
  - Scouts Also Have The Option Of Using Certain Hikes For Hike-A-Thons
    - ▶ 100% Of This Money Goes Into The Scouts Account
- Earnings For The Troop
  - Our Troop Also Has Kroger & Dorothy Lane Market Rewards and Restaurant Rewards
    - ► These Funds Go Directly Toward The Troop Which Allows Us To Lessen The Costs Of Certain Activities
- Money Earned Through Events
  - ▶ If The Scout Leaves Scouting, This Money Remains With The Troop
  - ▶ If The Scout Moves To Another Troop, They Can Move The Money With Them

# Campout Information

- Details For Each Campout Are Posted In Scoutbook
- Scoutbook Generates A Troop Wide E-mail To RSVP
- Each Campout Has A Planning Meeting Before The Scheduled Meeting. Typically, Those Planning Meetings Are 5:30-6:30
- At These Meetings:
  - Scouts Select Tentmates
  - Decide Who Brings What
    - ▶ Example: One Scout May Bring The Tent and The Other May Bring The Tarp
  - Menus Are Decided \*\* More Information On Next Slide \*\*
  - ▶ Dates, Times & Location Information Are Discussed
  - Leaders Plan To Have Enough Drivers
- PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU RSVP TO EVENTS

# Camping Food


- ▶ When We Campout, Scouts Plan & Cook All Meals
- Each Scout, At Some Point, Will Purchase Food Needed For Campouts
  - Scouts Buying Food Should Bring The Food In A Separate Tote & Are Expected To Put Cold Items In A Cooler With Ice
  - ▶ The Troop Has Coolers That Can Be Borrowed & Picked Up At The Planning Meeting
- ▶ Please Save Your Receipts & Submit for Reimbursement For Food
- IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT MEALS
  - Your Scout Will Need To Eat Dinner On Their Own on Friday Before We Leave
  - Meals Provided On the Campout Include:
    - Snacks on Friday Night
    - Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner and Snacks on Saturday
    - Breakfast on Sunday Prior To Leaving
  - THERE IS A BUDGET Scouts Are Thrifty
    - ▶ The Goal Is To Stay Close To \$10.00-\$12.00/Scout Total
    - Each Patrol Handles Their Own Food
    - This Goal Should Include: 2 Evening Snacks, 2 Breakfasts, 1 Lunch & 1 Dinner
    - This Is Camping So Nothing Fancy
    - Scouts DO Need To Bring A Water Bottle With Them To Drink & The Troop Has Large Water Coolers For Refills
    - ▶ The Food Buyer Has The Authority To Adjust The Menu As Needed When Purchasing Food

    - ▶ If you are camping more than 72 hours, you will also need the part C medical form
    - ▶ Paid the National and Council fees
    - ► Complete additional training online for your chosen role

### How Do I...


- Become a Merit Badge Counselor...
  - ▶ You do not have to be a registered adult to become a Merit Badge Counselor
  - ▶ If you just want to be a MB Counselor only, you must complete:
    - Youth Protection Training
    - An BSA Adult Application
    - ► A Merit Badge Counselor Application
    - Complete additional training online for Merit Badge Counselors
    - ▶ Once you pay the \$25.00 fee and all of the above steps are completed, submit your receipt and the troop will reimburse you the \$25.00 fee
  - ▶ If you are already a registered adult, you must complete:
    - ► A Merit Badge Counselor Application
    - ► Complete additional training online for Merit Badge Counselors
    - ▶ Since you are a registered member, there are no additional fees for this role
  - You can look at our website to see who the MB Counselors are and what Merit Badge Counselors we still need
